Description: Successful businesses are started every day by creative out of the box thinkers.. can you say homeschoolers?? Why can't it be one of our kids?!! The Fayette Rotary is working with us to put together a program teaching students basic business skills: sales and marketing, business plans, cashflow, etc. Then the students will have the opportunity to present a business plan to co-op leadership. If the plan is accepted, an investor will invest \$100 into their business. At the end of the year, students will present their business experience to the group and pay back their \$100 initial investment but may keep anything above that initial amount earned through their business.
